The story of Ampofo

After my parents' divorce, my brother and I had to live with my father at a young age. When he went to Nigeria, he left us with an aunt. She dies soon after and since my family has no money to take care of us, so her neighbour takes us in. He gives me a new name, Richard Prempeh Ampofo. Thanks to the neighbour, I was able to finish my Junior High School. I would like to continue studying and get an education in a technical school but unfortunately there is no money for that. In consultation with the neighbour, I choose to become a furniture maker. The neighbour pays for my tools. After this master-apprentice journey, I continued with other masters, all with their own speciality. This has made me a good craftsman and I am very keen to pass on my knowledge and skill to a new generation.

Craftsmanship is mastership

At this time, the master-apprentice route is still the same as when Ampofo started learning to be a furniture maker. The duration of the project is four years. The apprentice is learning from a master for 3 years. The fourth year he works independently for the master in gratitude for his training. The apprentice completes the period with an official examination through NVTI (National Vocational Training Institute). After passing this, he receives a Certificate.



Together with the boards in the Netherlands and Ghana, we looked at how best to start the masterapprentice project. We will start with 2 students, internally and bear the financial responsibility for the entire project. If this project succeeds, we will expand.



Ampofo is a versatile man. With equal precision, he makes a cabinet, a door, a roof or a coffin.



Added value

As in the Netherlands, the funiture maker trade is not very popular among young people. In Ghana, too, practical education is looked down upon these days. Because of reactions from their environment, young people (especially boys) often do not dare to choose a master-apprentice route. We think it is important to draw attention to the furniture making trade and make it attractive.

Bringing boys from another region to Oyoko and offering them accommodation will make it easier for them to develop. The additional provision of practical English lessons and preparatory education for their own business is an extra incentive for them to take the plunge. They also participate in a personal development programme within the **Quashie School Project**. By having theoretical and practical students go through a development together, there is a greater understanding and respect for each other. Together with obtaining a certificate, the masterapprentice project provides students with a good foundation for their future.

Costs of the master-apprentice project

The duration of the master-apprentice project is four years. As there are one-off and annual costs, we show the total for four years. The table below is a calculation for 2 students.

Each apprentice gets their own set of tools for them to work with. After obtaining the certificate, it becomes their property, as a start for their own business.
