





garlic. When the onions are glazy add the rice and stir fry it for 2 to 3 minutes on a low heat. The rice should not go brown. Slowly add boiling water. Bring to a boil again, add salt to the taste and simmer with lid on the pan for 5 minutes. Then place the pan in the New Cooking Bag. After one hour the food will be ready. (Caution: water with oil can splash, so add it slowly!) Preparation for omelette sauce Cut the tomatoes, sweet bell pepper and small pepper into small cubes. Heat the oil and stir fry the vegetables al dente. Add the beaten eggs and keep stirring until a grainy sauce arises. Season with salt.

Put the oil in a hot pan and add the onions and


